Albania is rapidly expanding its fiber optic infrastructure, supported by national operators, international projects, and specialized equipment suppliers.

National Fiber Optic Infrastructure

Albania's fiber optic network is being developed to enhance both domestic and international data transmission. The Albanian Telecommunications Union (ATU) has constructed over 450 km of fiber and more than 7 Points of Presence (PoPs) in major cities, using DWDM transmission technology to ensure high-capacity and reliable connectivity. The network also connects to neighboring countries, enabling cross-border data flow and Direct Internet Access (DIA) services for businesses and service providers. The national regulatory authority, AKEP, coordinates with operators to map and manage the backbone network, ensuring compliance with EU standards and facilitating investment-friendly access.

Key Projects and International Initiatives

A major development is the submarine fiber optic cable project between Egypt and Albania, led by the Hungarian group 4iG in cooperation with the Albanian government. This high-capacity line positions Albania as a strategic gateway for East-West data traffic, supporting the creation of a large data center in Durres and laying the groundwork for future technologies like 5G. Investments in this project exceed 100 million euros, highlighting Albania's commitment to becoming a regional hub for digital communications.

The deployment of fiber optic networks in Albania is guided by Law no. 9918 and Regulation no. 22, which set technical requirements for urban and suburban infrastructure, including fiber optics. The government and AKEP aim to improve access to physical infrastructure, support high-capacity networks, and ensure timely spectrum allocation for emerging technologies . The national broadband roadmap aligns with the Digital Agenda for the Western Balkans, promoting sustainable development and reducing digital gaps.
