

# Cable tray cleaning requirements

## Article Overview

Cable tray cleaning should follow NEMA and IEC guidelines, with regular inspections and cleaning every 6-12 months to prevent dust accumulation, overheating, and fire hazards.

## Regulatory and Standards Framework

Cable tray systems are governed by several standards and guidelines:

- o OSHA requires employers to maintain a safe workplace free from recognized hazards, which includes ensuring cable trays are free from dust and debris that could pose fire or electrical risks (29 CFR 1910.305(a)(3)), .
- o NEMA Standards: NEMA VE 1 and VE 2 provide guidance on the installation, maintenance, and modification of metal cable trays, while NEMA FG-1 (for nonmetallic trays) outlines similar requirements .
- o IEC 61537: This international standard specifies mechanical strength, corrosion resistance, electrical continuity, fire resistance, ventilation, and fill ratio for cable trays, indirectly supporting proper maintenance and cleaning practices .

## Cleaning Frequency and Procedures

- o Inspection and Cleaning Interval: Facilities should inspect and clean cable trays every 6-12 months, with more frequent cleaning in dusty or industrial environments .
- o Preparation: Turn off or isolate power where possible to ensure safety during cleaning .
- o Cleaning Tools: Use HEPA-filter vacuums, soft brushes, or mild detergents for metal or stainless-steel trays. Avoid abrasive cleaners that can damage tray surfaces .
- o Focus Areas: Pay attention to tray bends, risers, corners, and joints where dust and debris accumulate most .
- o Outdoor or Heavy-Duty Trays: Pressure washing is acceptable only if the tray is empty and disconnected from live installations .

- o Ensure no residual dust, debris, or corrosion remains.
- o Check for damaged insulation, rust, or structural issues that may require repair or replacement .
- o Verify that cable trays maintain proper ventilation and fill ratios to prevent overheating .
