Cable trays can be installed on or near pipe walls, but proper spacing, insulation, and protective measures are essential to ensure safety and functionality.

Installation Guidelines

Cable trays are designed to support electrical, power, signal, and communication cables, and they can be mounted on walls, columns, beams, or alongside pipe racks in industrial settings . When installing cable trays near pipes:

o Parallel Installation: Cable trays should be arranged on one side of the pipe rack. They should not be installed directly above pipelines carrying corrosive gases or below pipelines carrying corrosive liquids. If unavoidable, maintain a minimum distance of 500 mm and use a corrosion-resistant partition . For thermal pipelines, the distance should be 500 mm with insulation and 1000 mm without insulation .

o Intersection Points: When cable trays intersect with pipelines, maintain a minimum distance of 500 mm for insulated thermal pipelines and 1000 mm for uninsulated pipelines. Protective measures such as corrosion-resistant cover plates or thermal insulation boards should extend at least $d + 2000$ mm, where d is the outer diameter of the pipe or insulation .

o Wall Penetrations: When cable trays pass through walls, sealing devices are required for fireproof or explosion-proof areas, and rainproof measures should be applied for outdoor transitions .

Safety Considerations

Maintaining proper spacing between cable trays and pipes is critical to prevent:

- o Heat damage from thermal pipelines
 - o Corrosion or chemical damage from pipelines carrying corrosive substances
 - o Electrical hazards such as short circuits or fire due to leaks or vibrations
- Cable trays can be installed vertically or horizontally, and their fill requirements remain the same in either orientation. Cables must be securely fastened to maintain integrity over long-term use .
