- o Ethernet Cable: Connects the ONT to the router's WAN port .

Setup Steps

- o Install the ONT: Plug the fiber optic cable into the ONT and power it on. Wait for the status lights to stabilize .
- o Connect the ONT to the Router: Use an Ethernet cable from the ONT's LAN port to the router's WAN port .
- o Configure the Router: Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1) and enter any ISP-provided credentials if required .
- o Test the Connection: Connect a device via Wi-Fi or Ethernet and verify internet access. Running a speed test can confirm you are receiving the expected fiber speeds .

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o Use quality cables and avoid bending the fiber optic cable, as it is fragile .
- o Place the router centrally in your home to maximize Wi-Fi coverage .
- o Ensure your router supports gigabit speeds or higher to fully leverage fiber's capabilities .
