

Article Overview

A distribution box should be wired with a clear layout: main MCB or isolator at the top, branch MCBs below, neutral and earth bars properly connected, and all wiring neatly organized and labeled for safety.

Key Components and Layout

- o Main MCB/Isolator: Acts as the primary switch to disconnect power to the entire distribution box. Typically a double-pole MCB for single-phase systems, rated according to total load (e.g., 63A for domestic installations) ().
- o Branch MCBs: Single-pole MCBs for individual circuits such as lighting, fans, or appliances. Double-pole MCBs may be used for high-power loads ().
- o RCCB/RCD: Provides protection against leakage currents and electric shocks. Usually rated at 30mA for domestic single-phase systems ().
- o Neutral and Earth Bars: Neutral wires from all circuits connect to the neutral bar, and all earth wires connect to the earth bar, which is linked to the building's grounding system ().

Wiring Guidelines

- o Connection Sequence: Connect the incoming phase and neutral from the energy meter to the main MCB. From the main MCB, connect to the RCCB, then distribute to branch MCBs ().
- o Wiring Direction: Typically, wiring from the main circuit breaker to branch breakers runs on the left, and outgoing wires to loads exit on the right ().
- o Wire Management: Use plastic ties to bind wires neatly, maintain uniform spacing, and avoid kinks or overlaps ().
- o Marking: Clearly label AC/DC supply, voltage levels, and circuit numbers for easy identification and maintenance ().
- o Safety Checks: After wiring, perform a thorough inspection to ensure no short circuits, overloads, or loose connections exist ().

- o RCCB output -> Branch MCBs (SP or DP)
- o Neutral wires -> Neutral bar
