Harmonized System (HS) and Customs Classification

For international trade and tariff purposes, fiber optic cables are classified under HS Code 8544.70. This code covers insulated electric conductors in which optical fibers transmit light signals for communication. Key points include:

- o Optical fibers alone (unassembled) fall under HS Code 9001.10.
- o Fiber optic connectors and components are classified under HS Code 8536.70.
- o Fiber optic transceivers use HS Code 8517.62, which covers machines for the reception, conversion, and transmission of data . HS codes may be extended with additional digits for country-specific tariff purposes, such as the U.S. Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS), but the base six-digit code remains 8544.70 for sheathed fiber optic cables.
