Distribution box and switch box shall be made of iron plate or high-quality insulating material, and the thickness of iron plate shall be greater than 1.5mm The electrical equipment in the distribution box

Where access to the wall behind the meter box and hockey stick is possible, the Developer shall pre-install a steel sheet of at least 1mm thickness to the wall behind the meter box to a minimum height

Residential: The recommended height for distribution board and consumer unit is between 1 metre to 1.8 metre from the floor. The suggested height is 1.3 metres
