The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. Verify that the installed cable tray allows for 20% expansion of the horizontal cabling system. Verify that the cable tray is supported

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The cable tray construction sequence is as follows: measurement positioning -> support hanger installation -> bridge installation ->

Securing cables will maintain proper spacing between cables, keep cables in the trays, and confine the cables to specific locations

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
