

# How are the cables in the distribution box connected in series

## Article Overview

To connect cables in series to a distribution box, use proper pigtail and sequential wiring while ensuring all safety protocols are followed.

## Safety First

Before starting, turn off the main breaker to de-energize the circuit and verify zero voltage using a non-contact voltage tester. Always wear insulated gloves and use appropriate tools such as wire strippers, screwdrivers, and insulated pliers to prevent electrical hazards .

## Understanding Series (Daisy-Chain) Wiring

Series or daisy-chain wiring involves running a cable from the distribution box to the first outlet, then continuing from that outlet to the next. This creates a continuous electrical path while using a single circuit breaker . In residential setups, this is often called "series" physically, but the electrical connection is effectively parallel, ensuring each device receives full voltage .

## Steps to Connect Cables

- o Identify Wires: In each cable, identify the hot (black or red), neutral (white), and ground (bare or green) wires.
- o Pigtail: In the distribution box, twist together the incoming and outgoing wires of the same type with a short pigtail wire. Connect the pigtail to the corresponding terminal on the MCB or busbar:
  - o Hot pigtail -> MCB terminal
  - o Neutral pigtail -> neutral busbar
  - o Ground pigtail -> grounding busbar
- o Sequential Connection: For subsequent outlets or sub-circuits, connect the incoming cable from the previous point to the next device using the same pigtail method. This ensures continuity even if one outlet fails .
- o Secure Connections: Use wire nuts and electrical tape to secure all connections. Ensure no bare wire is exposed except for grounding.
- o Labeling: Clearly label each circuit in the distribution box for easy identification and future maintenance .

## Additional Tips

- o Use the correct wire gauge: 14 AWG for 15A circuits and 12 AWG for 20A circuits.
- o Maintain proper separation of live, neutral, and ground wires to prevent short circuits.
- o Ensure all MCBs, RCDs, and busbars are rated for the total load of the connected devices . By following
