

How long can cable trays be used

Standard cable tray lengths typically range from 3 meters (10 feet) to 30 feet, with some manufacturers offering lengths up to 40 feet depending on the application.

Standard Lengths

Most cable trays are manufactured in 3-meter (10-foot) segments, which are easy to transport and handle on-site, while still allowing for long runs when connected with splice plates . For industrial and commercial applications, NEMA standard lengths include 12, 20, 24, and 30 feet, with some manufacturers providing up to 40 feet for special installations . These longer trays are often used outdoors or in areas where reducing the number of supports is desirable.

Factors Affecting Tray Length Selection

- o Support Span: Short-span trays are typically supported every 6-8 feet, intermediate spans every 10-12 feet, long spans 14-20 feet, and extra-long spans over 20 feet . The tray length should always be equal to or longer than the support span to ensure structural integrity.
- o Load Requirements: The length chosen must accommodate the weight of the cables and any environmental loads such as wind, snow, or ice .
- o Installation Practicality: Shorter segments are easier to handle and install, while longer segments reduce the number of joints and supports needed, which can save time and cost.
