Understanding Distribution Levels

Electrical distribution systems are organized into three main levels:

- o Primary Distribution (First Level): This level carries medium voltage (typically 4 kV to 35 kV) from the substation to distribution transformers. It is not directly used by electrical equipment and includes isolation switches and circuit breakers for safety and control .

It provides mains voltage (typically 220-240 V single-phase) and contains single-phase circuit breakers and leakage protection switches to ensure safety for household or office equipment .

The distribution box serves as the central control point for a building's electrical system. Its main functions include:

- o Receiving incoming power from the secondary distribution cabinet or transformer.
- o Dividing power into multiple circuits for different areas or appliances.
- o Providing overcurrent protection via circuit breakers or fuses to prevent overheating and fire hazards.
- o Allowing safe disconnection of circuits for maintenance or emergencies .
