

How much does it cost to splice a 48-core optical fiber cable

The quoted per-splice rate usually includes OTDR verification but excludes materials like closures, trays, or project management fees (SpliceList).

48-Core Fiber Optic Splice Closures

A 48-core dome-type fiber optic splice closure is designed to protect and organize spliced fibers in outdoor or indoor environments. These closures provide IP68 protection, strong mechanical strength, and resistance to harsh environmental conditions. They include splice trays with adequate curvature radius for fiber winding and allow individual fiber management. Closures are suitable for ribbon-type and common optical cables, and can be installed in overhead, embedded, or manhole situations (ME Fiber Optic, Alibaba, FiberOpticalSplitter).

Price Range

- o 48-core dome-type splice closures: approximately \$30-\$100 per unit, depending on supplier, included accessories, and shipping (Alibaba, FiberOpticalSplitter).
