- o Avoid crossing wires unnecessarily and keep wires from running over devices .
- o Maintain minimum spacing between wires and devices (2-4 inches depending on voltage) to allow airflow and safe access .

Label and Number Wires

Every wire should have a unique number or label corresponding to the schematic. This reduces errors during installation and troubleshooting. Use color-coded ferrules or markers to indicate wire gauge and function .

Secure and Manage Wires

- o Use cable ties, saddles, or clips to hold wires in place, but minimize ties inside wire ducts to avoid cutting them during maintenance .
- o Leave service loops for easier replacement or testing.
- o For hinged doors, use U-loops and protective sleeves to prevent wire damage .

Grounding and Safety

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Ensure all metallic enclosures, doors, and panels are properly grounded. Use separate protective earth conductors where applicable and test continuity to prevent electrical hazards .

Heat Management and Avoiding Overcrowding

Avoid tight bundling of wires to prevent hotspots. Plan for adequate spacing to maintain airflow and prevent overheating. Follow clearance standards such as IEC 60204 or UL 508A .

Tools and Accessories

Use professional tools and accessories like bootlace ferrules, heat shrink tubing, and proper stripping/crimping tools to ensure secure and neat connections .
