

How to use a self-provided fiber optic router

You can use your own router with fiber internet by connecting it to the ISP-provided ONT or gateway and configuring the necessary settings like VLAN, PPPoE, or IP passthrough.

Check Compatibility

Before connecting your router, ensure it has a Gigabit Ethernet WAN port and supports high-speed connections, as fiber internet can exceed 1 Gbps. Routers designed for DSL or cable may not work with fiber. Modern Wi-Fi 6 routers are generally compatible, but look for "fiber-ready" specifications to handle symmetrical upload and download speeds (Mercury Fiber) .

Connect Your Router

- o Locate the ONT or Fiber Jack: Your ISP installs an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) or Fiber Jack that converts fiber signals into Ethernet. Ensure it is powered and activated (GFiber, Vodafone) .
- o Use an Ethernet Cable: Connect the ONT's Ethernet port to your router's WAN port.
- o Bridge or Passthrough Mode (if needed): Some ISPs, like AT&T, require enabling IP passthrough or bridge mode on the gateway to allow your router to manage all network traffic .

Configure Router Settings

- o PPPoE: Enter the username and password provided by your ISP if required (Vodafone, AT&T) .
- o VLAN ID: Some ISPs require a specific VLAN ID to connect. For example, Vodafone may use VLAN 7 or 132 .
- o DHCP: Ensure your router's DHCP server is enabled to assign IP addresses to connected devices.
- o Wi-Fi Settings: Configure SSID and password if your router will handle wireless connections.

Test Your Connection

After setup, check your internet speed and connectivity. If speeds are lower than expected, verify VLAN, PPPoE credentials, and that the router is compatible with fiber speeds .

Additional Considerations

- o ISP Restrictions: Some ISPs may require returning their router if you cancel service (GFiber) .
- o Security and Updates: Using your own router means you are responsible for firmware updates, network security, and troubleshooting.
- o Advanced Setups: For multiple static IPs or complex networks, bridge mode may be necessary to avoid
