Material Verification

- o Review certifications: Cross-check material quality certificates and compliance with project specifications and international standards such as IEC 60364 or IEEE .

Dimensions and Sizing

- o Measure tray dimensions: Confirm width, depth, and metal thickness match approved drawings and can accommodate the planned cable load .
- o Check thermal expansion provisions: Ensure long tray runs have allowances for expansion and contraction .

Routing and Layout

- o Verify tray routes: Ensure alignment with approved shop drawings, avoiding interference with structural elements, HVAC systems, or other utilities .
- o Check elevation and clearance: Maintain proper distance from floors, ceilings, and heat sources to comply with safety codes .

Supports and Mounting

- o Inspect support spacing: Confirm supports, brackets, and hangers are correctly spaced and securely fastened to prevent sagging or vibrations .
- o Check fasteners: Ensure bolts, nuts, and fixings are appropriate and tightened according to manufacturer specifications .

Earthing and Safety

- o Verify grounding: Ensure metal trays are properly earthed with earth tags at joints to prevent electrical hazards .

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o Safety compliance: Confirm that all handling and inspection activities follow PPE requirements and site safety protocols, including Lockout/Tagout if necessary .

Documentation and Coordination

o Cross-check drawings: Ensure all trays match "Issued for Construction" (IFC) drawings and are coordinated with other services .

o Record inspection results: Maintain detailed documentation of material verification, measurements, and any discrepancies for QA/QC purposes . By systematically following these inspection points, factories can ensure that cable trays meet quality, safety, and design requirements before installation, reducing the risk of delays, rework, or system failures.
