

Method for Labeling Specifications and Models of Distribution Boxes

Distribution boxes should be labeled using standardized logistic labels that include unique identifiers, product specifications, and shipment details to ensure traceability and compliance.

Key Labeling Requirements

1. Unique Identification: Each distribution box, or logistic unit, must have a unique serial number, typically using the Serial Shipping Container Code (SSCC). This allows the box to be tracked and matched with electronic business messages throughout the supply chain, supporting applications like cross-docking, automated receiving, and shipment routing (GS1 Logistic Label Guideline) . 2. Essential Information on Labels: Labels should include the following details:

- o Product or part number
- o Model or specification of the item
- o Purchase Order number and line number
- o Engineering revision or version
- o Quantity and packaging level (e.g., cases, pallets)
- o Hazardous material indicators if applicable, following GHS standards for chemicals . 3. Packaging Levels: Labeling should reflect the tertiary packaging level, such as cases or pallets, which are standard logistic units containing trade items or inner packs. Each level may require its own label to ensure proper identification and handling . 4. Compliance with Standards:
 - o GS1 Standards: Use GS1 barcodes and labeling formats for global traceability and interoperability .
 - o Organizational Specifications: Follow internal or client-specific labeling requirements, such as Gentex or UNICEF specifications, which may include additional fields like expiration dates, certificates of analysis, or shipment instructions . 5. Label Placement and Durability:
 - o Labels should be clearly visible and securely attached to the box.
 - o Use waterproof or durable materials to protect against moisture, handling, and environmental conditions during transport .
 - o For pallets, ensure labels are placed on at least two sides for easy scanning and identification. 6.

Documentation and Verification:

- o Each shipment should be accompanied by a packing slip or shipping document that matches the information on the labels.
- o For international shipments, include proper Incoterms and ensure all documentation is legible and in the required language .

Best Practices

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- o Standardize label formats across all distribution boxes to reduce errors.
- o Include both human-readable text and machine-readable barcodes.
- o Regularly audit labeling compliance to avoid rework costs and ensure regulatory adherence.
