PoE switch LEDs indicate power status, port activity, link speed, and system health, helping you monitor and troubleshoot your network.

Power and System Status LEDs

- o Power (PWR) LED: Green solid indicates the switch is powered on and functioning normally; off means no power or a connection issue; yellow may indicate a backup power supply is active or a power module fault .
- o System (SYS) LED: Green flashing shows the system is starting up; green solid means normal operation; red solid indicates a system fault such as fan failure or overheating .

PoE Mode LEDs

- o PoE LED on each port: Green solid indicates the port is providing PoE power to a connected device; off means PoE is disabled or not required by the device .
- o PoE types: Some switches differentiate between PoE, PoE+, or UPOE, which may be indicated by LED color or mode selection .

Port Status and Activity LEDs

- o Link/Speed LED:
 - o Solid green: link established and stable.
 - o Blinking green: data is actively being transmitted.
 - o Amber/orange: slower speed, configuration mismatch, or minor errors.
 - o Off: no link detected; check cable, power, or port configuration .
- o Speed indication: LEDs may change color to indicate port speed (e.g., green for 1 Gbps, amber for 100 Mbps) depending on the switch model .
- o Activity LED: Blinks to show traffic on the port; some switches combine link and activity into a single multicolor LED .

Troubleshooting Tips

- o If a port LED is off, verify the cable, connected device, and port configuration.
 - o Amber or blinking LEDs may indicate errors such as collisions, CRC errors, or STP blocking; check switch logs and port settings .
 - o Ensure the total PoE power budget is not exceeded to prevent overload and maintain switch stability .
