When vertically installed, the height of cable trays from the ground should not be lower than 1.8 meters. When horizontally installed, the height from the ground should not be lower than 2.5

A generic guideline developed by the Cable Tray Institute indicates that cable trays should not be filled in excess of 40-50% of the inside area of the tray or of the tray's maximum weight based on the cable

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
