Overview of Fiber Optic Pigtails

A fiber optic pigtail is a short length of optical fiber, typically 0.5 to 2 meters, with a factory-installed connector on one end and bare fiber on the other. The connector end is polished and tested to ensure low insertion loss and high return loss, while the bare fiber end is designed for fusion or mechanical splicing to a larger fiber optic cable in the field . Pigtails are essential for terminating fibers from large cables at Optical Distribution Frames (ODFs), terminal boxes, or patch panels, providing reliable and cost-effective connections without the need for field-installed connectors .

Role in Samoa's Network Infrastructure

Samoa's telecommunications network relies on submarine fiber optic cables to connect the islands to global networks. Key systems include:

- o Tui-Samoa Cable: Connects Apia, Samoa to Suva, Fiji, with landing stations at Savusavu, Wallis and Futuna, and Savai'i, providing high-quality connectivity and wholesale capacity to local operators .
- o ASH (America Samoa Hawaii) and SAS (Samoa-American Samoa) Cables: These cables link Samoa and American Samoa to Hawaii, enabling inter-island communication and access to global networks. They significantly increase capacity compared to older systems like the PACRIM East cable . In these systems, fiber optic pigtails are used to splice the submarine cable fibers to local distribution networks, ensuring fast, reliable, and low-loss connections from the landing stations to local ISPs and end-user networks . This setup allows Samoa to efficiently manage network terminations and maintain high-quality internet services.
