Safety and Tools

Only competent personnel should perform the removal, especially when dealing with structural supports or damaged trays.

Step-by-Step Removal

- o Remove Support Structures: Loosen bolts on the furthest supports first, using a jack to transfer the load if necessary. Check stability after each removal and treat any damaged protective coatings with anti-corrosion solutions.
- o Disassemble Tray Sections: Lift straight sections as one piece to prevent damage. For turns or bends, disassemble section by section. Use a loosening agent for rusty bolts instead of cutting.
- o Protect Existing Cables: Secure active cables using racks or anchor points every 2 meters for vertical runs. Separate power and control cables to prevent interference, and use insulating tape at joints.
- o Disconnect and Remove Cables: Carefully disconnect cables from devices and patch panels. Use fish tapes and pull rods for cables running through walls or ceilings.
- o Sort and Collect Materials: Separate metal parts by type for recycling or disposal. Organize removed cables and clean the area to maintain a safe and clutter-free environment.

Post-Removal Considerations

- o Conduct a final inspection to ensure no active cables were damaged.
- o Maintain clear labeling and documentation for future upgrades or maintenance.
- o Replace or repair any damaged tray sections to maintain structural integrity.
