

Should a gigabit router be used with a 200m fiber optic connection

Fiber length vs. router speed: The physical length of a fiber optic cable, such as 200 meters, does not determine the type of router you need. Using a router with lower-speed ports could limit your network performance even if the fiber itself supports higher speeds . **Wi-Fi considerations:** If you plan to use wireless devices, the router's Wi-Fi standard also affects performance. Modern Wi-Fi 6 or 6E routers are recommended for high-speed fiber to ensure efficient device management and low latency . **ONT requirement:** Fiber internet uses an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) instead of a modem. The ONT converts the optical signal to an electrical signal for your router. Your router connects to the ONT via Ethernet, and the router's speed determines how much of the fiber's bandwidth is available to your devices .

Practical Advice

- o If your fiber plan is below 1 Gbps, a standard router with 100 Mbps ports may suffice, though a gigabit router is recommended for future-proofing .
 - o For plans at or above 1 Gbps, a gigabit or multi-gigabit router is necessary to fully utilize the connection .
 - o Router placement, number of devices, and Wi-Fi coverage also influence real-world speeds, so consider mesh systems or Wi-Fi extenders for larger homes .
- Conclusion:** The 200-meter fiber length itself does not require a gigabit router. The deciding factor is the speed of your fiber internet plan. To achieve full performance, ensure your router's WAN and LAN ports match or exceed your plan's maximum speed, and consider modern Wi-Fi standards for wireless devices .
