

# TP-PoE switches can be used as regular switches

- o **Device Compatibility:** Standard PoE protocols are safe for non-PoE devices, but non-standard PoE devices may pose a risk if connected to a PoE-enabled port without proper configuration .
- o **Network Flexibility:** PoE switches provide the advantage of mixing PoE and non-PoE devices on the same network, offering flexibility for future upgrades .
