For example, a single-gang box with multiple wires or a GFCI outlet may require a depth closer to 3.5 inches. Internal volume, measured in cubic inches, is equally important. Standard single-gang boxes usually provide at least 18 cubic inches of internal space, while multi-gang or junction boxes offer more depending on the number of conductors and devices.

Plastic and metal boxes often share similar face dimensions, but internal volume and depth options can differ. Metal boxes may require additional space for grounding and mounting hardware.
