

Why can't the fiber optic cable get into the router

Signal Conversion Requirement

After the ONT converts the light signal, you can connect it to your router using an Ethernet cable, allowing your router to distribute the internet connection to your devices.

Router Compatibility

Some specialized routers have SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable) or fiber-ready WAN ports that can accept optical transceivers, but most home routers do not. In such cases, the ONT is mandatory to bridge the fiber network to your router. Attempting to bypass the ONT or plug fiber directly into a standard router will result in no connectivity.

Alternative Solutions

For setups where fiber must interface with existing Ethernet infrastructure, media converters or routers with integrated SFP ports can be used. These devices convert the optical signal to electrical form, similar to an ONT, enabling compatibility with standard networking equipment.
